TVC Officer Reports:

State Delegates Report (Kathy Worthington):

The last Oregon Federation Meeting was held on July 31 at the Summer Festival in Seaside. 300 people attended the Festival, and there was a small profit.

Next year's Summer Festival will be held in Salem, on July 14-16. There are a few dry camping spots at \$10 a night. Since it is on school grounds, there is no smoking or alcohol allowed. Flyer available for the dance at the State Capitol on the 14th.

The 2017 Mid Winter Festival is coming along nicely. Mike Seastrom and Hunter Keller are the callers. Sharon and Casey Parker are the cuers.

Tim Roberts has 616 names for the OFN online. If you have put an ad in the OFN online, Tim wants to know whether it is working for you. He would like some feedback.

The Federation Treasurer, Lane Clem, handed out checks for the Susan Corbett gift.

OFSRDC President's Report (Kay Rogers):

Notes from the last Federation meeting:

Kathy Roberts was seated as second vice president to replace Chuck Garner. In September Kathy will move into the first vice position. Dave Cooper will assume Kathy's 2nd Vice President chair.

Time to order state directories. We need to get the number of directories you want for distribution at the Sept meeting.

Insurance paperwork will be handed out at the Sept. state meeting also. We will distribute them at the Sept. TVC meeting. Please be prepared to either pick them up for your club or make sure you know who is going to do that.

The TVC nominated Karen and Ferrous Steinka for the Randall Award.

I will bring forms back from the meeting for registering for Mid Winter. Please plan to attend to support your favorite activity.

PAC Report: (Kathy Roberts):

- The PAC's 5th Friday dance on Sept 30, at the Oak Grove Community Center. They are going to have Terry Halley and Mike Halley calling with Julie Stiers Cueing. The dance is a mainstream dance with every third tip plus. Pre-rounds will start at 7:30 pm.
- There will be NW Cuer Association Workshop on October 29-31 in Washington on how to teach dancers and work with callers & equipment. Currently, our cuers and callers belong to BMI/ASCAP. SECAM, a fairly new organization from Europe is attempting to buy most of the artists' musical rights to songs and movie themes in Europe and the United States. Cuers, probably more so than callers will have to buy another insurance to protect themselves from lawsuits depending on the music they select. Cuers and Callers have to prove that they own the music they are playing. The fine per song is extremely high if you get caught playing a piece of music they downloaded but did not pay for. ****Delegates, please communicate this to your clubs' cuers and callers.****
- The PAC is in the process of revising their By Laws and Practices and Procedures. They are basing a lot of their changes on the TVC's. They were interested in the Ambassador Card program and are considering instigating one of their own.
- The state has sold the trailers. The PAC purchased one of them for \$1 and has stored it with their other trailer. They are in the process of figuring out how they are going to handle requests for the use of their trailer. They are going to create a contract for non PAC clubs to

sign. They are currently recommending when one or more non-PAC club uses their trailers, they will require a refundable \$100 deposit if the trailer is returned in good working order and a \$50 nonrefundable rental fee.

OFSRDC Publicity Report (Kathy Roberts):

Our new Federation FaceBook page is up to 184 members. Clubs are posting their own flyers there and dancers are sharing them on their own pages. I used FaceBook to help promote Summer Festival for the last several months as well posting flyers for clubs that I pick up at other meetings or have been sent to me. I've also searched the web so I could post flyers for the National Convention, the UsaWest Convention, Diamond Lake, and other regional dances.

If you would like to join the FaceBook page, the page is called the Oregon Federation of Square and Round Dance Clubs. Type this in the Search Bar at the top of your wall. Click "Join" and once your request has been accepted, you will be able to post your own flyers and share dances our dancers might be interested in attending.

State Fair Dancing: On Tuesday, August 29th there are 18 dancers registered to dance with Sandy Harris at 11:30 am; on Wednesday August 30th there are 31 round dancers registered to dance with Ken Pratt; on Thursday August 31st there are 30 registered to dance with Mike Halley and guest caller KC Curtis; and on Saturday, September 3 there are 90 youth registered to dance with Janienne Alexander and Jonny Roberts. OFSRDC Education Report (Kathy Roberts):

During Summer Festival we had an Educational Seminar on how to use Social Media to help promote your clubs. Amanda Roberts touched on a few of the applications such as Tumblr and Twitter and focused on Facebook. She ended the seminar on how to use Google Docs to improve communication within our clubs. If anyone in the PAC would like to have Amanda come and talk about FB, Social Media, and or Google Docs, Amanda is willing to come over for a training session. Over the next few months, I will be sharing information with you on various subjects that our clubs might find useful. I was asked last month to share how the dance attendance for TVC clubs is counted at TVC dances for the banners. Per the discussion during the October 2011 TVC meeting, the calculations are based on the number of people listed on the insurance roster with the state. For example, during yesterday's dance, I used the number of dancers listed on the insurance club rosters to determine the number of dancers registered. This does not include dancers in more than one club. Once I had that number, we counted the number of dancers who had signed in to the dance. The number of dancers registered, was divided by the number of dancers on the insurance records to arrive at a percentage. The Sunset Promenaders had 42 listed on the insurance roster and had 13 dancers in attendance. Dividing 13 by 42 gave an answer of .30952 or 31% of their club was in attendance, giving them the highest percentage of attendance by club. Thank you Debra Welch for directing me to the correct minutes for the discussion.

Next month, our subject will be how to post flyers and photos to your account and a group account that you are a member of.

Review from June's TVC meeting, per request from State Delegate Kathy Worthington:

If your club is considering holding a demo dance, or dancing during a mystery trip, dancing in a parade, dancing in a different location on your regular night, hosting a special

dance, or dancing at a time different from what your club lists on its annual Federation or Association Club Listing Form, you must request insurance for this special dance activity by submitting a Notification of Dance Event Form (www.squaredance.gen.or.us/insurance/NotificationOfEvent.html) through the link on the Federation website prior to the dance. This includes ALL club activities where you will be dancing. You only need to turn in one form per event if several clubs are involved, the club or council that is taking the lead should submit the form. This form should be turned in even if you are only going to dance once. It should also be completed and turned in even if you are participating in a demo dance where the hosting party has their own insurance. Our insurance does not cover you while you are traveling to and from your special location – it covers your dancers at your dance event.

If a dancer is injured during a Federation dance, an Accident Report Form needs to be completed and submitted to our Insurance Chairman Kay Rogers through the insurance link on the Federation website (www.squaredance.gen.or.us/insurance/AccidentForm.html). For those times you do not have internet access, an Accident Report Form (www.usda.org/insinfo/accident%20report%20form.pdf) should be kept in your dance halls, in your cash box, or carried with you to a special event in case of an injury. Once you have internet access, submit the information that you gathered through the link.
