There was discussion about the New Year's Eve dance times, some felt the need to start later than in the past. More discussion next meeting, many ideas expressed.

The January 2015 dance will be a regular square dance with rounds, not just a round dance. Please support the Hahn Picnic and Barn Dance this Sunday and the Round Dance Party on Halloween, October 31st.

Dale concerned about the January 31st, 2015 dance because it will be five months in a row to have a TVC dance and Dale is suggesting not having a dance because of fatigue but Gary said he thought we should. This was planned to be a round dance but Dale and others suggested changing to a Mainstream dance with Rounds instead and it was agreed by the Delegates to do that.

Dale is requesting help on getting callers and cuers for the dances.

Debra Welch suggested we do some Contra or Line dances at one of our TVC dances to help getting some of our friends and neighbors to come out to our dance.

Kathy Roberts commented that when she works with the youth and uses an hour before a dance to "teach" Contra or other dances so that youth can invite anyone to the dance and they have had as many as three squares show up, giving us a chance to get them interested in dance classes.

Treasurer report: (Lane Clem via email) (Balance Sheet and Income Report was distributed)

The main item that sticks out in the balance sheet is the inventory of \$519.21 of fabric purchased for the 2016 Summer Festival for TVC members to buy to help advertise the Festival; if you are going to

purchase this fabric to sew shirts and skirts please do it soon to eliminate the inventory. Other than that, the balance sheet shows the TVC with about the same dollars as last year.

Secretary report: (Tom Sminia) No report

State Delegates report: (Kathy Worthington)

Dave Cooper (Past-Federation President) asked Bob and Carolyn Bosh If they would like to be the new Goodwill Ambassadors for Oregon. They didn't want to have a five year commitment, so it was voted on that the term is now two years.

The 2014 Summer Festival reported that they had 265 dancers, which is down from the past few years.

The 2015 Mid-Winter Festival has asked how many program books we wanted and I requested 50 of them. I don't think we ran out last year, does anyone need more?

Kathy Worthington handed out the insurance forms. These need to be returned to Kathy W. by the 29th of October. Kathy changed the date that Kay gave her because after 3rd of November she will be gone for a month.

Kay R. mention that if you have an accident you can now report it online on the Federation Website. In the State Meeting Past President Vivian reported that the fund raiser raised a little over \$1,200 for the Oregon Food Bank.

Kathy Roberts told us about the 3 options for youth dances.

Marilyn Schmit talked about the dancing at the State Fair which sounded like a good turn-out.

Under old business the OFN Advisory Committee has not renewed the OFN Editor Joyce Sherman's contract. So the last printed issue will be January. For those who have subscriptions you will receive a refund from January to the end of your subscription time. They are not taking any more subscriptions, so the Hahn Barn Dance will not be a subscription dance. The OFN next year will be on the internet and Tim Roberts is in charge of setting this all up. This is going to take a few months to get up and running. When you have an article or flyer you will send it to your club webmaster and then the club webmaster will edit and send it on to Tim.

Kathy asked for a vote on who the delegates wanted to vote for to receive the Randall Award this year and the Swenson's, Paul and Dottie, were selected.

(Kathy Roberts) The Oregon Federation held its quarterly state meeting yesterday.

Usually, what happens there is mostly of an administrative nature, but yesterday did have one item of importance. The Federation has voted to cease printed publication of the OFN. The January issue, which you will receive at the end of December, will be the final printed issue of the OFN. The Federation is losing money on every issue, and it's so much work to put it together that we can't find volunteers to do it anymore.

Between now and then, Tim Roberts will be setting up an online "OFN", where clubs will be able to send flyers, club news, announcements, "Where and When", and photos. There will be no charge for this. We may charge a nominal amount for advertisements from non-Federated clubs to cover the small expenses; that kind of detail and other details still have to be worked out.

They decided to have each club pay \$20.00 per year per club and this will include the "OFN" on the internet. (Dale W.)

This is a very large change, and there is no doubt that the transition will be painful. We have a lot of things to figure out. By this time next year, we'll all be used to the new way of doing things, but until then we need to be patient. The TVC Hahn Barn dance, which was to be a subscription dance, is no longer going to be a subscription dance. If your subscription expires between now and January, you

should not renew. After the beginning of the year, the Federation will send out refund checks to anyone who wants one. There are a lot of things that are not clear yet and there will be a lot of changes and evaluations. There will be a lot more information later.

State Youth Activities Report: (Kathy Roberts) For Mid-Winter we are going to have a travel theme for the youth; going to have flags, information about countries, special badges, they will be learning about these countries, etc. Also going to show the youth some style moves to do in dances, etc. If you know of any youth dancers that need assistance Kathy can help out in that. Also if you know of any senior high school students this year that are members of a Federated Club they can apply for a scholarship from the Federation for college; Oregon has \$500 and USDA has \$1,000 scholarships available.

Old Business:

(Kay Rogers, Past President and 2016 Summer Festival 2016 Chairman) For 2016 summer festival, how do you feel about dancing all on one floor? The one floor idea will be considered next meeting again. If we can get by with one floor it will save a lot of money and work. We need to advertise which we are doing and will not go back on whatever we decide. The options are to rent or purchase the floor material, dance on carpet, dance on tile, or schedule the dancing alternating from sessions of Mainstream, Plus, Rounds, Contra, Advanced Rounds, etc. Flooring for this dance will be 5,000 square feet to pay for and to lay. Kay recommends one floor but will plan according to what you want to do. Mid-Winter is buying a new floor and would maybe be willing to sell us the old floor.
