### **President's report:** (Dale Brabham)

Welcome guests, delegates, and officers of the TVC.

Recent items in the news are causing concern to be expressed over the safety of youth in square dancing. Tonight Kay and Kathy will cover what is being done to address this issue by the OFSRDC. It is important for those of us not directly affected to consider what we can do. Some of us are at a loss at even what to think of it. How should we react?

Here are three things we can do. First, we can, as leaders in square dance, is to show sensitivity to the people and clubs affected. We can privately acknowledge and validate their feelings of loss and hurt. We must console our friends. Second, it is no small gesture for us to visit the club and just dance with them. Please visit. And third, in spite of what has happened, we must continue to believe that square dance is generally a wholesome and safe activity. [How else can we promote square dance and invite people to learn to square dance?] If we collectively do these three things we can begin to repair the damage that has been done.

I am grateful to the OFSRDC for stepping up to the challenge of this troubling situation. It would be easy for us to become disheartened and downcast, as there is no positive spin or up side to what has happened. Still, it is good to know that the leadership is taking action. Let us do our part. Let us remain positive in spirit and respond by our continued, enthusiastic support for square dance.

On a positive note, we will also hear tonight about very successful anniversary dances. This is gratifying to the leadership of the TVC and especially the clubs; and we look forward to your continued support of anniversary and special TVC dances.

If you read the cover letter you should not have problems. But if you do, let me know. Also, please fill in ALL of the information in the Enrollment Form. This includes all of the addresses of your dance locations.

There was a committee appointed to discuss all the ways a background check should be done in order to insure the safety of the youth in our organization. I believe Kathy has something to say about this.

Please do not gossip on Facebook, Twitter, etc. regarding the recent items in the news. We do not need the publicity.

**PAC report:** (Kathy Roberts)

We really need a volunteer for Alternate State Delegate that attends the PAC meetings.

*Notes from last week's PAC meeting:*

Caller and Cuer Advisors Scott Zinser and Tami Helms noted that Caller and Cuer contracts should not be sent by e-mail since they are blank, and they do not have signatures. The contracts should be completed and mailed or handed directly to the callers and cuers. Two copies should be made; one for the caller or cuer and one for the PAC. Contracts should include information about what happens if the dance is cancelled, and how much lead time is needed for clubs to notify the callers and cuers of the cancellations. Contracts should also include information about what to do if double booking occurs. The contract wording from Callerlab will be investigated next month on the Caller and Cuer contracts. The wording will be brought back to the PAC and TVC.

The PAC has two trailers for rental. The Web Site for the trailers is being worked on. Rental fees will be \$50 per rental, and a \$100 refundable reservation fee.

No information available yet for the Starlight Parade in June.

The PAC is very impressed by the TVC Anniversary Dance visitations, so the PAC is considering doing its own Anniversary Dance visitations in the near future.

The PAC is still doing Burgerville Fund Raisers. If your club is in not-so-great financial shape, this may be an option. Clubs may need a Food Handler's Card from their governing agencies to participate.

**OFSRDC Publicity and Education Report:** (Kathy Roberts)

The OSFRDC Facebook Page has 196 members. It's great to see the information, flyers, special dances, etc. that is being posted on this page. When you comment on that post, it will return to the top of the page.

I am writing an article on how to convert your Word files (or other files) into PDF or JPEG files. When finished, a link will be provided to a Google Docs file of the article.

616 people have been getting e-mail notices notifying them that the next issue of the OFN has come out. There were 2000 hits on last month's OFN online.

50 to 60 youth participated at the Oregon State Fair Dance in September. Callers Janienne Alexander and Jonny Roberts did a fantastic job. At least 100 were in the audience.
