We had many complements from our state guests about the old fashioned weekend where the council supported the dance and everyone was so friendly.

For example I know the Sunset Promenaders and Valley Squares often cancel their dance in support of each other's anniversaries. Dances were also cancelled in support of the state weekend at the Kinton Grange. Another example of working together is a larger club, the Sunset Promenaders, working with a smaller club, the Hayshakers, on their Seaside Sashay. The Tri-Council dance is also an example of 3 councils working together each year. Everyone benefits when we work together helping each other.
