We will reinstate the TVC banner award for the club with the highest % membership attendance at the Hahn Barn dance, as both the large banner and the traveling banner have been found, and the award calculation form has been updated with club membership as of September, 2023, per the OFN. Motion made by Dale Brabham that any club that is eligible to win the banner will not do so more than once a year; Pete Cooper seconded. The new stipulation was voted on and approved that any club is eligible to win the banner not more often than once a year.

Changing the adult admission to dances from \$6 to \$8 means that we should evaluate the admission for youth and family. Motion made by Mike Duyck to increase our TVC dance fees for \$4 for youth and \$20 for families; Pete Cooper seconded. Voted and approved to increase youth to \$4 and family to \$20. Also, a change to admission means that updates should be made to TVC Bylaws Article 4, and TVC Practices and Procedures Article 10.
