Treasurer report: (Lane Clem) Lane handed out financial reports but since we have not had an event there were only minor changes. The present balance is \$13,035.67 at the end of July. One item was the Aloha Grange refunded the deposit they had asked the TVC to pay. Another item was paying Tom \$49.22 for the supplies used in producing the TVC 2014-2015 Directories. Lane needs to collect for the State Directories if can pay tonight that is good, if not tonight I am not going to be at the next meeting so please mail me a check for the ordered directories. Lane will not be at the Hahn picnic and dance, so we need some volunteers to take care of the door including the split the pot, and calculate the information for attendance. Lane will take care of all the signs and sign-in sheets, etc. Gary will have the check books so he will be able to take care caller and cuer pay. Bill Calder volunteered to do these things and we will help support Bill at the dance.

Secretary report: (Tom Sminia) The TVC Directories are available to hand out during old business; that is about all that I have. Thank you.

State Delegates report: (Kathy Roberts)

No State meeting since the last meeting so there is no report. The State did award one \$500.00 scholarship this year to Mireya Bukite from Mid-Willamette and she is going to Chemeketa Community College and study agriculture.

As I mentioned in June there is going to be some changes in the OFN; the State committee is working a proposal of what changes we need to make; the decisions will be made at the September meeting. The proposal will probably be something like going on line to reduce the cost and yet keep the information available to dancers. Kathy is available to take suggestions to the committee working on this. One suggestion was to raise the price of the OFN, another to reduce the information down to reduce the cost. The Hoedowners would like to see a 6 month subscription for new dancers. Another idea was to not go on-line because some dancers do not have computers. By going on line the available information would be more up to date, now there is a whole month after the articles are submitted until they are published. The cost of putting the OFN or something like it on the internet would be so much less than the present printed magazine. If it goes on the web it will be done in a way that each club can print the pages. It can be setup so you can print off the section you wish; for example a list of classes and this can be so much more fresh information. The cost of printing pages is so little now. There are a lot of issues being discussed and worked on. Come to the State Meeting on September 21st in Salem and learn firsthand what is decided. Also Dale Worthington becomes our new president at the meeting.

The Youth will be dancing at the State Fair on September 1st from 11:00 to 12:00. If you want to dance to loud music and high energy with KC Curtis and Jonny Roberts calling come join us.

Past President report: (Kay Rogers)

I have a comment on the 2016 Summer Festival caller is Andy Allemao from California, and Dave Cooper will be the cuer. The rent is relatively cheap; we will be paying \$1,500 for the weekend and they do most of the facilities work for us but we will need a floor if we need more than one floor to dance on. We would pay at least a \$1,000 to put down a floor over a carpet or whatever. Many festivals around the country just dance on one floor and we can do that if we have sessions of dance of one hour each; such as Plus and Rounds one session, Mainstream and Rounds another session, etc. I would like to propose that we do the one floor setup with sessions and we need you to agree with that now so we can plan accordingly. Maybe we will take a vote at next month's meeting. Does that sound good? Then when word gets out we are doing that it will

affect our attendance one way or the other; so we need to stick with what we decide to do.

Also, at the September State meeting I will be handing out the insurance papers and we need to have someone from each club that is responsible be designated to receive these, process the papers and get them back to me done correctly.

Kay also mentioned that Dave Cooper and others will help struggling clubs to save them from failing. For example do the Wave Stepper need or want some help? Anyway if you know of a club that needs help the State does have funds and people to help if the club needs and wants some help.

OFN Area Editor Report: (Ferrous Steinka) Tom received an email from Ferrous and he was not able to attend because of other commitments. So Tom read the report and the complete report follows:
