#### ACCIDENT TRAINING

Make sure that you and your club officers, especially the president, know the procedure to follow in case someone falls or has an accident at your dances. People do slip and go down while dancing. Once in a while they experience injuries serious enough to require medical treatment. It is important to attend to them appropriately.

Falling is embarrassing and the natural instinct is to get back up and deny any damage. The nearest people should encourage the fallen to rest and evaluate themselves. If they really are okay, then they can get back up on their own. If they are hurt or cannot get up on their own, someone present with medical training should take over. If no one with medical training is present, then call 911. It is important not to move or encourage the person to move until it is determined that doing so will not cause further harm.

It is for this very situation that OFRSDC provide us with liability insurance. It is necessary to collect information in a timely manner. This begins by filing an accident report. The presiding officer reports what happened in detail and provides names of who was hurt, as well as names of witnesses and all of their contact information. If the injured is transported to a facility for medical treatment, the insurance company will need the name of the facility. Get this information at the time of the accident!

Within 48 hours submit the accident report. The accident report form can be found online at <a href="https://squaredance.gen.or.us/">https://squaredance.gen.or.us/</a>. You will find "Report Accident Online" under INSURANCE FORMS. The filled out form will be sent directly in and you can print out a copy of the submittal.

If the person is transported for medical treatment the presiding officer must also follow the status of that person. This means calling and checking on them.
