Could you go back and ask your clubs and report at the next meeting some comments so we can provide some feedback to the committee (Emerald Empire in particular as they always prepare the booklets). Plans are in the making for next year so feedback is helpful.

A few less advanced tickets were sold for Summer Festival this year as compared with years past, but we are still in good shape. If you are planning to go please purchase your ribbons early. The Summer Festival committee is still in need of a Facilities and a Vendor Chairman. Contact Lorri or Cece if interested. If you do not have their contact information, I can always relay the information if you email me (dancengrin@gmail.com).

It's renewal time soon for BMI, ASCAP and SESAC licenses for callers and cuers (renew by March 31st) so be sure and check to ensure your club caller and cuer has renewed those licenses so you can avoid steep fines if it is determined their licenses lapsed and they played music at a dance anyway. It is recommended you physically check to see these licenses, or ask to have a copy for your files. A caller's license does not cover your cuer. The same applies if a caller or cuer comes to a club as a guest, they must have a current license to play music at your event. It is recommended you physically check and verify these licenses, or ask to have a copy for your files. If you would like more information on how all of this works, there are plans for an educational seminar (approx 1 hour) on this topic coming soon--perhaps at Summer Festival.

February marks the time for the councils to work on the Randall Award recipient paperwork for next year. Go back to your clubs and let them know so that they have ample time to select the deserving people to run and get paperwork prepared, double-checked and submitted to the TVC. You will also need a nice photo of the nominee(s). The Randall Award nomination paperwork is available for download from the federation website. If you have someone you want to nominate but you don't have all their facts for writing up their bio, don't let that stop you. Submit what you have to the TVC about why you think the person should be nominated and if the TVC agrees, there will be assistance to get the paperwork completed.

Please update your club officer membership information on the Federation Web site as soon as your elections have occured. Enter the new information and save it, then please go back and make sure what you changed has actually changed. I've seen several clubs spend time to update their roster and then I've seen it not save reverting back to what it was previously. At the top of the form there is also a place for you to enter the number of current memberships. You also need to enter your student names and contact information on the Federation Web site. As soon as a student joins your club you then need to collect their club dues, add them to your membership roster and send off money to the current Insurance Chair to cover the current year for their insurance.

I was given flyers for the Pear Blossom Festival, April 8-10 (Haworth/Lobatto); Summer Festival, July 15-17 (Carnathan/Lobatto); and Diamond Lake, July 20-23 (Wood & Ramey/Wood) so if you are interested these are likely available soon on the OFN.
