STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS

Finance Chair: Michael McMullen and Lalani Radford for Gary Clark The Finance Committee presented a report detailing actual budgets for the following years (2007-2008, 2008-2009, and 2009-2010). Additionally they proposed a 2010-2011 budget.

- Proposed Income will total \$4,682.00 based on Dance Income (\$4,369.00), State Directory (\$100.00), TVC Dues (\$63.00), Ad Sales in TVC Directory (\$150.00) and Other (\$313.00).
- Proposed Expenses will total \$5,850.00 based on Dance Expenses (\$3,150.00) and Other Expenses (\$2,700.00).
- Proposed Loss would amount to **\$1,168.00**.

The Members at Large suggested the following ways to decrease TVC's loss:

- 1) Have the door fees for TVC dances increase to \$6.00, \$7.00 or more dollars.
- 2) Plan successful dances that are fun and that will ensure that people attend.
- 3) Plan fundraisers, such as: a) Provide coffee at freeway rest stops. B) Sell fireworks.
- 4) Hold a 4th or 5thth Friday and/or Sunday dance. Tom Sminia suggested the dance could be entitled "*Thank Goodness It's Friday Dance*".

It was suggested that the Finance Committee reconvene in order to suggest further recommendations at another board meeting, detailing ideas for projected cost savings or added income.

Michael McMullen moved that the proposed 2010-1011 budget for the coming year be accepted, with the provision that changes can be made, if needed. The motion passed unanimously. The copy of the approved budget is attached; please share with your clubs.

This year we resumed having a picnic. With the Tualatin Commons adjacent to the grange, we had our choice of eating inside or out. The weather encouraged eating inside, and we had a fun and delicious time, with lots of guests joining us. Our annual *Root Beer Float Dance* August 7 should be even more fun this year. Winona Grange has agreed to some improvements that should make it much less challenging to dance during the summer. They're working on three areas: Ventilation, Insulation, and Lighting. Two attic fans and some soffit vents have already been installed, as has a whole-hall, 2-speed exhaust fan. Eventually, fresh air will come in under and behind the stage area, but for now, we will still need to open windows. Along with converting to compact fluorescent bulbs, additional lights are being installed, with more switches, for about the same maximum amount of light. An additional/ alternative circuit of low-wattage ambience lighting will make it possible to have enough light to dance, without adding significantly to the heat load. Insulation on the attic floor along with the attic fans should keep most of the heat out of the hall. Taken as a package, these improvements should make a big difference. Most of the lights have been installed, and by the time you read this, the insulation should be in. If all goes well, everything will be done before our July 17 dance.
