President's report: (Dale Brabham)

We, the TVC, are the leaders in bringing square dance to our area. One of the most important characteristics we can demonstrate when we plan, talk about, and host square dances is enthusiasm. When we are enthusiastic, people around us get excited about what we are doing. It is contagious. So, the next time you are planning, hosting, or participating in a square dance, give yourself a pep talk. Engage in your dances 100 percent, boost your excitement level, and make yourself a worthy ambassador of square dance.

It is important to remember that the people we work with in all levels of square dance leadership are mostly volunteers. We must work on the assumption that everyone is trying their hardest (even if it is obvious that they are not). Sometimes things are done that upset us. This is the time when we must double our effort to encourage our people, give positive feedback, and avoid giving harsh criticism. It is possible to give critical feedback without giving offense – strive to be kind. Take good care of your volunteers.

It is no big secret that square dance participation is in decline. People today are busy; they have many choices; and stereotypical images of square dance just do not appeal to them. However, our TVC is strong and growing. We must strive to continue to do what we do best. And on top of that we have to think of more and better ways to appeal to young people and families. Please let me know any creative ideas you have. Tonight Daryl Clendenin gives an invitation to come together with callers to brainstorm how to increase appeal.

Enthusiasm, kindness to volunteers, and innovation are three ways to help make square dance strong. Tonight is our last meeting before either the Summer Festival or the Hahn Barn Dance. Let's commit ourselves to making these events successful.

 - Each Federated Club is a member of a Council and the OFSRDC
 - The OFSRDC website is a warehouse of valuable information for our clubs
 - The quick links on the left side will direct you to our state publication the Oregon Federation News or OFN (ofn.club)
 - Towards the bottom of the links on the left you will find club insurance information
- Notification of Dance Event Form
 - (www.squaredance.gen.or.us/insurance/NotificationOfEvent.html)
 - Any dance that is different from your regular dance location, day, or time MUST have a completed Notification of Dance Event Form submitted through the link prior to the dance event in order to request insurance
 - This includes ALL dance demos, special dances, barn dances, dances on mystery trips, parades etc.
 - Only one form per event needs to be turned in. If several clubs are involved, the club
 or council that is taking the lead should submit the form
 - This form should be turned in even if you are only going to dance once
 - This form should be turned in even if you are participating in a demo dance where the hosting party has their own insurance
 - The Notification of Event Form communicates a need for coverage to our insurance company through the USDA.
 - The insurance protects your club, council, and/or Federation in the event of a law suit should anyone be injured while dancing
 - It provides secondary medical coverage if a Federated dancer is injured while dancing – It is not the dancers' primary insurance.
 - Insurance for your regular dance location & dates and your regular lessons information are listed once a year in the fall on the <u>Federation or Association Club</u>

<u>Listing</u> form. Insurance Chairman Kay Rogers will be distributing the forms and directions to the council delegates during the OFSRDC September State Meeting

 - An Accident Report Form should be kept in your dance halls, in your cash box, or carried with you to a special event in case of an injury in case you do not have access to the internet. Once you have internet access, submit the information that you gathered through the link
 - If you have access to the internet at the time of the injury, the information can be submitted directly on-line (www.squaredance.gen.or.us/insurance/AccidentForm.html)
 - o If a dancer is injured while dancing at a Federated dance or event, submit the information on the form to the Insurance Chairman through the link on the website under insurance as soon as possible
