Vice-President Report: Debra Welch

249 dancers attended the Tri Council Dance; we grossed \$939. TVC had133 members attending, which was a wonderful turnout. There were 25 Independent dancers, 46 PAC members, and 45 Evergreen Council dancers. Hoedowners had the highest percentage of TVC dancers participating with 32 danc-

ers and Sunset Promenaders in second place, with 21 dancers. Thank you, everyone, for a job very well done!

TVC State Delegate: Mike Duyck

The State meeting was held May 14th in Bend, Oregon. My notes from that meeting follow:

- The 2011 Winter Festival was successful with the State and the council each netting \$1,750.00.
- The OFN now has 847 subscribers. The Birthday (Anniversary) dance ads are free for each club. The OFN will run the banner inventory of each club all summer, if submitted.
- The dance for Adaptive Riding received \$1,614 and 100 plus dancers were present.
- Randall award nominees are due to Lee Ashwill by May 28th.
- The State Historian, Zola, would like to have photos and obsolete banners bought to the summer festival and turned in for our history file.
- Kathy Roberts needs to have a report from each club on the youth in each club.
- The State fair has 5 demos this year. Tony Haskins is the contact. TVC used Ferrous Steinka for our coordinator last year.
- The summer State meeting will be at Reynolds HS at 9:15 am on July 10th.
- Oregon councils with no clubs will no longer have a vote at State meetings but will be retained for future development. They will not host any State meetings.
- Grant fund requests will be submitted to the grant fund committee, who will recommend grants to the State. Grants are to be no more than 50% of the expense and the request must show the other 50% has come from fund raising or council/club donations.
- A new caller grant was made of \$400 to Kippon Perot (sp.?). This is to attend class at Circle 8 this summer with total expenses of about \$1,200 including food and housing. He has already raised about \$550 of the funds needed.
- Clubs or councils hosting State meetings should notify all area club presidents and officers and invite other federated persons to attend.
- Umpqua Council made a request for funds to pay callers for their county fair. This was turned down
 as other callers attend the state fair and county fairs and call for only free admission. National callers or festival callers are paid for calling but not for demonstration work.
- One of the new caller students is receiving caller instruction from Jim Swenson in Walla Walla. The Blue Mountain/Eastern Oregon council is seeking information on the proper way to obtain funding for this new caller. They were referred to the P&Ps and to proceed thru their council.
- The expense reimbursement to members and ambassadors was sent to committee for review. \$20 housing and \$0.30 per mile hasn't been updated in 8 to 10 years.
- Daryl Clendenin is trying to encourage new callers in the Oregon. He has a caller's school every year.
- Jim and Kay Rogers, Blue Mountain, is sponsoring a weekend dance April 6 to 8 in Pendleton.
- Mid Willamette is the host for the September State meeting.
- The Braids and Braves are holding 1 dance per month until their funds improve.
- Chuck Garner is new caller for Oaky Doaks.
- Diamond Lake will feature Daryl Clendenin this year.
- Summer Festival needs dancers for showcase of rounds.
- Suggestion for recruiting new dancers: Attend the medical center seminars and meetings to suggest square dancing as a means of exercise and mental stimulation. The age group that attends is the major source of new dancer students.
- The Coquille's "Sets-In-Order" will have their 65th Birthday Dance on October 8, 2011 at the Coquille Community Building. Featured will be the Guest Caller is Bob Ewing and Cuer Denise Harris. TVC Calendar (Debra Welch)

Debra Welch has formed a committee to work on producing a TVC Calendar, that illustrates TVC due dates and club dance information. One of her objectives is to reduce calendar conflicts, so that clubs can more readily attend each other's Anniversary Dances. She pointed out that last year the Toe Draggers and Tri Squares had their Anniversary Dance on the same night – September 17th. She asked attendees to brain-storm ideas to maximize club participation at Anniversary Dances.

- 1. Carolene Ginocchio (Valley Squares President): Valley Squares, who normally dance on the 1st and 3rd Saturdays, moved their Anniversary Dance to a 2nd Friday, a night which conflicted with only one other club.
- 2. Ray Sullivan (Sunset Promenaders). If you plan a dance on a Friday, then some dancers will have to attend two dances in a row one on Friday and one of Saturday.
- 3. Linda Curtis (Toe Draggers). She suggested that the Tri Squares and Toe Draggers get to-

- gether and try to resolve the scheduling conflict.
- Carolene Ginocchio (Valley Squares President): Plans to hold a TVC President's Meeting and discuss this issue.

Door Entrance Fee For TVC Dances (Debra Welch and Finance Committee)

Debra Welch and the Finance Committee recommended that the door entrance fee for TVC Dances be raised from \$5.00 to \$6.00. Their reasons for doing this are: (1) This will support TVC's goal to be sustainable and balance the budget; (2) TVC will serve as a model so that club dances will feel they can raise their door fees as well. Currently, some clubs are not able to pay for the cost of their dances, with a \$5.00 fee.

K.C. Curtis said this was a good idea, as \$6.00 is still a very inexpensive way to pay for great entertainment. Michael McMullen indicated that the Executive Committee in Washington State were raising their fees to \$7.00 and their special dances to \$10.00.

A motion was made and seconded to: Raise the TVC Dance Entrance Fees from \$5.00 to \$6.00. It passed unanimously.

Hahn Barn Dance

Members recommend that the Hahn Barn Dance be advertised in the OFN. Since this is a subscription dance, Vivian Fairburn, OFN Editor, charges half of the usual price.

Club Needs Survey (Mary T. Withers)

A Club Needs Survey was developed. The purpose of this survey is to determine the square and round dancing issues that impact our TVC Clubs. The results from these surveys will be used to structure TVC meetings, so that important issues, identified by clubs, will be discussed and addressed, with the purpose of finding solutions or support.

Clubs were asked to go back to their members and officers, discuss the listed issues and indicate if an issue is (1) No Concern; (2) A Little Concern; (3) A Big Concern; (4) Not Applicable. The results of this survey will be used to plan discussion topics throughout the year.

Cancel June Meeting (Debra Welch)

The TVC Board recommended that the June meeting be cancelled in order that committees could meet to prepare for the year. There are several new committees, with club representatives as part of these committees, that will be spending a lot of time preparing. A large part of this year's efforts is to "Refocus and Strengthen The Role And Involvement of The TVC Delegates, Away From The Club Reporter, To That of A Club Representative, A Communicator Regarding Issues, And A Decision Maker". In order to do this properly, there will be a Delegate Training Session in July, discussing their major responsibilities and expectations. Additionally, it is hoped that clubs spend a valuable amount of time on their *Club Needs Survey*. This information will be summarized at the July meeting and topics for TVC consideration will be prioritized for discussion.

A motion was made and seconded to: Cancel the June TVC Delegates Meeting, In Order To Allow Sufficient Time for Committee Work. Ten delegates and Elected Officers voted to cancel the meeting and 2 voted not to cancel the meeting. The motion passed.

Delegate Training (Debra Welch)

A Delegate Training session is scheduled for 6:30 at the July TVC meeting.
