Secretary report: (Andis Garuts) No report.

State Delegates report: (Laura Irvan)

The **price of the State Directories** is \$5 a piece. My email is incorrect in the directory, it is listed as "autopay.." instead of "autoplay..."

There will be a **training session at the Midwinter Festival** about what to do for a **medical incident** at your club. They are requesting that **one representative from each club attends this training**. Please fill out the accident report when there is an incident even if the person does not go to the hospital. There needs to be documentation to help detail events for any possible medical or liability insurance coverage. The liability insurance covers the club and the building for liability. The medical coverage is a "secondary" coverage and covers a part of the medical bills that the person's primary insurance may not cover.

This year Vicki is going to work directly with each club in TVC to **electronically fill out the yearly insurance updates**. She is hoping to streamline this process and is experimenting with two Councils to test out this process.

Many clubs have not **updated their contact information online with the OFN**. Please check that your club has done this. If you need help with this I can help you get into the system. You choose your club and put in the password which I can help you with.

Our new Vice President at the state level is very enthusiastic and discussed how he talked to people in town as he was interacting with them. He gathered names and telephone numbers of people interested in taking square dance lessons... He said things like... "I heard no one wanted to square dance" or "would you be interested in square dancing?" He gave the telephone numbers to the local club.

Currently no one is hosting the **Summer Festival for 2026**. There is a committee meeting to see if they can try to make the Festival happen but it is not guaranteed. There is also an interest in creating a round dance weekend whether or not it is hosted by the federation. There are no hosts for the future summer festivals either. They would love for a club to volunteer to host the future summer festivals. Normally the process to plan the festival starts 3 years in advance. Unfortunately there is volunteer fatigue and also the summer festival attendance has been weak. They did make a profit this year but a big part of the profit was from the raffle and other fund raising events. Update: discussion about reasons that people do not attend the Summer Festivals.

Grants/scholarships offered to youth are not needs based or ability based. The decision is made on the basis of having passion for the dance. One recipient submitted their application in crayon as the applicant was disabled and when they received the grant the family was very emotional due to the other applications not succeeding at other places. The main message is if you have the passion put in the application. There are state and national grants/scholarships given to youth. The youth must have been involved in square dance at least for one year and must have one member of the club recommending the youth.

Credit Cards / other non cash payments - High Desert Dancers are using **Zelle** for entrance to dances. This can be done to eliminate the need for cash and there are no fees to do this. Bill Randall was the member that did the research on which system to use. If the dancer's bank has Zelle available the transfer is free and easy to set up. Other options like Square and Venmo do have fees to pay.

Two clubs in PAC got together and did a **targeted mailing** which included 3 groups of post cards sent. The cost was about \$1,000 divided between the two clubs. One club was mailing 462 households and the other 472. They targeted households that had people 45-60, and there was also a qualification about how old the kids were. Express Copy was the company they worked with. Betty from PAC can provide other information.

Question was posed from TVC about the state's stance on the new groupings of **mainstream and plus dance groupings**. These changes have not been completed yet so the state has no stance yet.

From the State Meeting - some highlights here, more detailed see the minutes from the State Meeting on the OFN.

Summer Festival 2025 - 225 attendees, most likely a bit more than break even for the event.

2026 Midwinter booklets will be available in November, and visitation chairs will be visiting as many clubs as possible.

Update OFN information - Clubs are being reminded to make sure their information on the OFN is up to date.

Randall award - TVC submitted one recommendation for the Randall award. Ours was the only submission during the July meeting but more are being solicited.

Midwinter Festival will have a session on how to deal with medical emergencies. The ask is for every club to send one representative to this meeting. One emphasis from Zola was never to move a person who has had an accident before the medics arrive.

Youth scholarships - Three youth will receive \$500 scholarships - Kaylia Avila, Courtney Phillips, and Elizabeth Wiesner. A suggestion that maybe these scholarship amounts should be increased.

Round dance weekend - Marilyn Schmit reported that they were hoping to organize a round dance weekend sometime next year. They are debating whether or not to do it with a mini lab which would require going through Roundalab (would have to apply for seed money and decisions would take longer) versus hosting it on their own.

USDA reports that an Oregon youth won the second place scholarship. Next year's scholarships will be given in the amounts of \$2,500, \$1,500, and \$1,000.

USDA grant/scholarship - An anonymous US Donor has given the USDA a \$5,000 annual donation to be given to the youth for scholarships, which will be given out in amounts ranging from \$250 - \$1,000. This money can be used by families for lessons, advertising, and convention and housing costs.

Webinars - There are monthly webinars and all are available for download to listen to or watch on the USDA website, www.USDA.org/webinars.

The **2028 National Square Dance** Convention will be held in Daytona Beach, FL

NEC Youth Hall at National Convention - A motion was passed for the Oregon Federation to write a letter to the NEC that we are in favor supporting the youth and not shutting down the youth hall. This was in response to the committee trying to shut down the youth hall partially due to hall limitations and to save money.

For the Council reports please see the OFN for the minutes, but below are **three items to highlight**

Youth participation in lesson - From the Interstate Highlanders - On June 18 the KCs caller, Cece Glidewell, did a youth square dance teach at Camp Esther Applegate. There were about 100 kids who were willing to learn to square dance. Per Cece Glidewell it was bedlam at first with that many youth, although, once the lesson got on the way the youth started getting the moves down quickly. The LDS church made a generous donation to the club in thanks for providing this experience for their campers who were mostly from the Bend and Burns, OR area.

Credit Cards - Joyce Welton: The High Desert Dancers are looking at accepting credit cards at their dances. Tim Roberts - it is easy, but it takes 3 ½%. Joyce – the club has a deal that if you buy 4 dances, you'll get the 5th dance for free. If they go to a credit card, they will be further ahead. Most

people aren't carrying that much cash. So, it's convenient. A caller thinks it is coming since people don't carry cash. Many times, when we are on the way to a dance we have to stop and get cash. The Round-up takes credit cards. They get more money at silent auction since they accept cards. There is a cost, but if you sell more, it is profitable.

Conflicting dances - Joyce Welton: We never go to a club dance during a State Festival. How come we have clubs not supporting the State Festival? To paraphrase the discussion, there are clubs that are holding dances at the same time as Festivals and this used to be discouraged to "encourage" people to attend the festivals.

PAC report: (Erin Kalmbach)

PAC did not meet in September. The postcard mailing does not seem to have encouraged any new dancers. Very disappointing. There are no PAC dances till next year. We decided not to have a dance on Halloween.
